

Voting Drop-off Rate


We cannot know why voters skipped contested races, but listed below are which positions they ignored. The first column is the total number voting in the 2010 general election. The second column is the number voting on the ballot measure, legislative or judicial positions. The third column is the second column subtracted from the first column and reflected as a percent. Of the 86,993 votes counted, 62,591 are from the 42nd District, 24,380 are from the 40th District and 22 are from the 39th District.

Daily Envelope Count

The Whatcom County auditor's office mailed 116,581 general election ballots to registered voters; 1,062 were undeliverable. Almost two-thirds — 56,570 or 64.70 percent — of the envelopes that contained ballots were counted before election day. Invalidated ballots (559) accounted for less than one-half of 1 percent of the total counted.

Envelopes Challenged

Some voters make errors, which cause their ballots to be rejected under the law, so their votes don't count. Below are the reasons and how many made each kind of mistake. The most common reason, by far, was an envelope with a late postmark. The statistics are from the Canvassing Board (Shirley Forslof, Sam Crawford and Royce Buckingham) Reconcilliation Report. The statistics represent the difference between envelopes received and ballots counted. Of the 87,431 envelopes returned, 86,993 were counted and 559 were rejected. Also two envelopes containing primary ballots were not counted.
